He is the grandson of a survivor of the Armenian Genocide, which led to his passion to create a Hip Hop song that would tell not only the story of his family's escape but the story of the Genocide as well. Along with the highly acclaimed producer Godfather and the beautifully talented singer Miriam, Marc wrote and recorded the song "1915," which does exactly that.

In it, Marc connects the Armenian Genocide to the Holocaust and to the other genocides of the past century that used the Armenian Genocide as a template. "1915" is a way to reach out to today's youth to inform them of the horrors that took place in that year and of the 100 year-long effort by Turkey to cover up this page of history.

Marc hopes that this song will be a call to action for the next generation to bear witness for the need for justice for the 1.5 million lives that lost in 1915.
