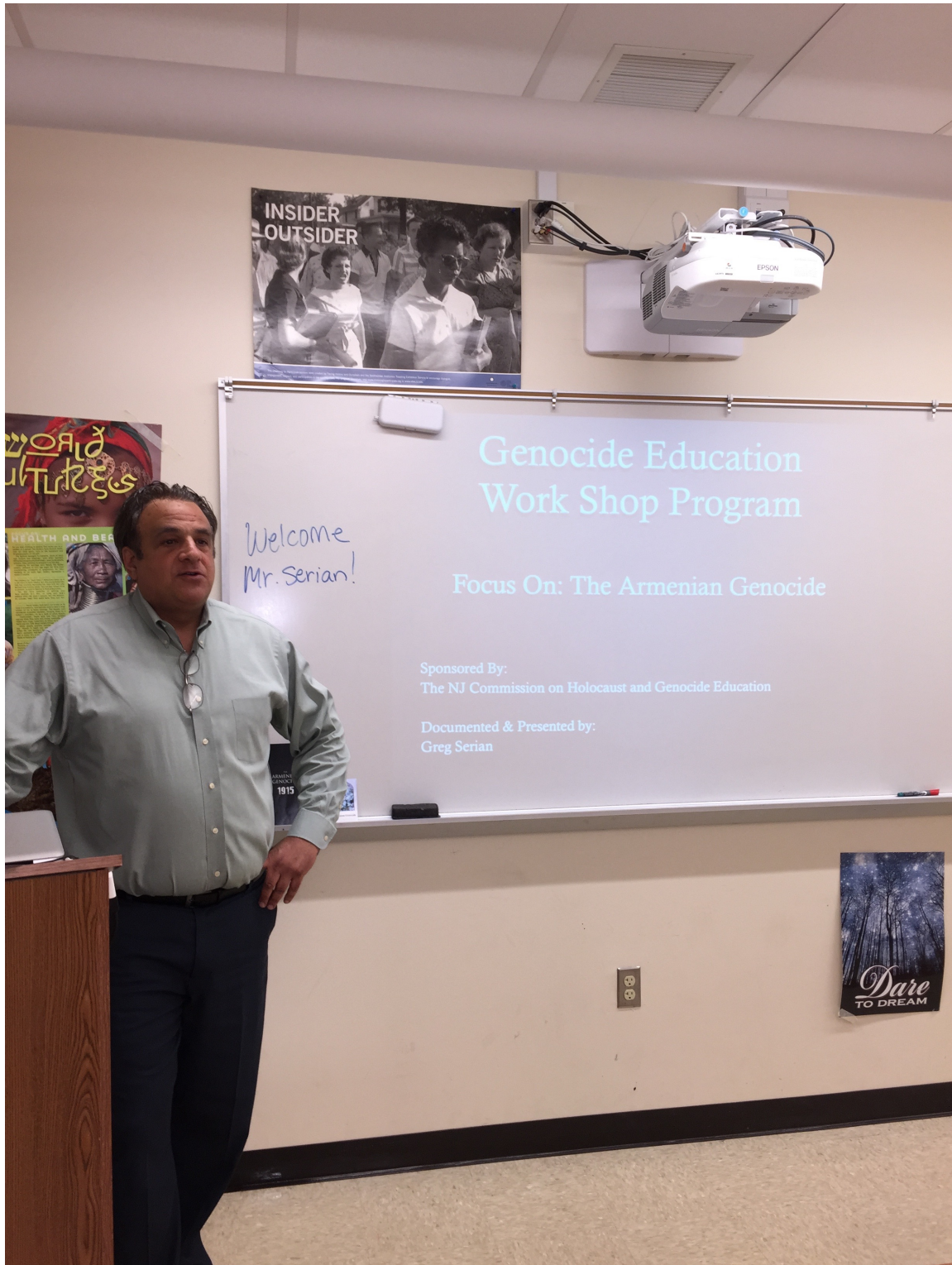
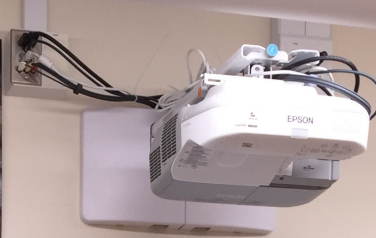
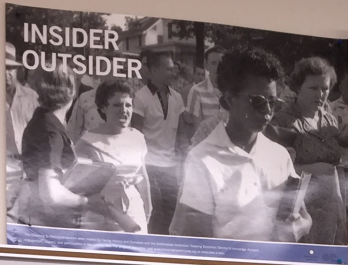


Watchung Hills Regional High School – May 2015

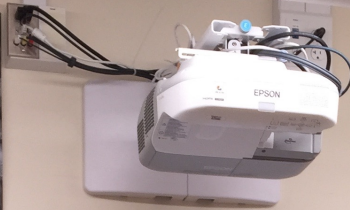
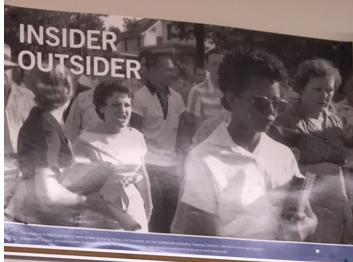

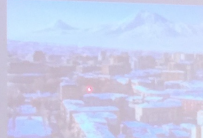
